Smart Thermostat Rebate Program

Installing a smart thermostat can help you reduce energy costs and keep your home comfortable year-round. Smart thermostats use sensors to tell when you're away, and can learn your daily schedule and use local weather information to make energy-saving temperature changes automatically. Because they are Wi-Fi enabled, smart thermostats allow you to manage your home heating and cooling system from anywhere, using your mobile device. OCEC is offering a \$100 rebate in the form of a VISA Gift Card to eligible members who purchase and install a qualified smart thermostat in their home.

You are eligible if you are an OCEC member and your home in the Methow Valley is heated by an electric forced air furnace or ducted heat pump, and you live in a single family or manufactured home, you are eligible for this rebate program.

Find out more information at www.OCEC.coop or contact our office for list of smart thermostats that qualify and for installation requirement details. You may also pick up details at Winthrop ACE Hardware.

The program is limited to one smart thermostat per furnace or heat pump with a limit of two per household. Additionally, it is limited to 900 units and will be discontinued when the limit is reached, or will expire on October 1st, 2018.

OCEC Announces Expansion of Solar Program

In 2017, the Washington State Legislature approved legislation that allows OCEC to expand its solar incentive program. The new program is open to members:

- 1) Who currently have solar generation and are not in the current program; or
- 2) Are planning on building a solar array in the future.
